# **DATE AND PLACE OF COMPETITION**

The Rhythmic Gymnastics competition at the XXII Central American and Caribbean Games will take place Tuesday, November 17th to Friday, November 21st, 2014 at the Veracruz Multi-Sports Center.

# **COMPETITION FORMAT**

This Competition Format will take place as per the International Federation's Regulations in the following manner:

**Qualification** – Qualification for individual and team finals:

• Teams are made up of a maximum of 5 gymnasts (plus one reserve), two routines with different implements must take place during the qualification phase.

• Individual gymnasts will compete in 4 implements on the program, maximum.

• Up to two gymnasts per NOC per implement or apparatus may qualify, as well as all teams as long as they participated in the qualification phase and obtained a qualifying score. In the event of a tied score, the FIG established tie-breaker system will be applied. If the tie remains, all the involved gymnasts will be scored.

The competition will take place in one subdivision, placing the gymnasts according to the draw that will happen at the Technical Meeting

This competition will define the individual final for general qualification, the highest scoring gymnast resulting from the addition of the scores of the 4 routines will win.

This competition will also define the group final for general qualification, the highest scoring team resulting from the addition of the scores of both routines will be the winner.



#### Final - (Finals per apparatus)

- The 8 highest ranked gymnasts in the qualification phase will compete, 2 athletes per NOC per apparatus maximum.
- In the event of a tie in the final score there will be no tiebreaker.
- Teams that have participated in the qualification phase in each apparatus will compete as long as they have obtained a qualifying score.
- Order of competition will be defined through a draw that will take place during the Technical Meeting.

# **COMPETITORS' AGES**

Athletes must be at least **16** years old by December 31st, 2014 (born in 1998).



# **MAXIMUM NUMBER OF COMPETITORS**

In accordance to the quota set by CACSO, the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition will have a maximum of **50** female athletes.

Each NOC may register a maximum of 9 female athletes, (3 for individual and group competition, and 5 as a team) as long as as the qualification criteria stipulated by UPAG for the Rhythmic Gymnastics competition at the XXII Central American and Caribbean Games, Veracruz 2014 are fulfilled.

#### Composition for the WAG and MAG competitions:

# **VERACRUZ 2014 QUALIFICATION SYSTEM**

a) Gymnasts must have an FIG license that is valid in 2014.

b) Mexico, as host country, may enter a full team of 9 athletes and one participation in each event.

Slots will be granted based on participation history for artistic gymnastics in the XXI Central American and Caribbean Games, Mayaguez 2012, the Pan American Senior Championship, 2010 and the XVI Pan American Games, 2011

UPAG will publish the slot allocation table for Veracruz 2014 before December 31st, 2012 and will consider the following as the maximum per event:

c) National Federations must confirm intention of participation in teams and individually in the XXII Central American and Caribbean Games, Veracruz 2014 to UPAG **at least a month before the 2013 Pan American Senior Championship**, the location and date of which has yet to be defined.

Countries that do not have assigned slots or in the event of a tie for a slot, participation in the All Around event at the Pan American Apparatus Championship 2013 will be taken into consideration to be able to assign the aforementioned slot. This will happen in the event that there not be enough slots to be given out without a qualifying event. In the event of free slots due to lack of confirmation, injury, doping, etc., these slots will be assigned to National Federations with individual participation according to their historical ranking,

d) UPAG will notify the NOCs and the Organizing Committee of the final slot distribution no later than **March 1st, 2014**, so the NOCs may be able to comply with the CACSO regulations on entry by name and number.

#### **Qualification system approval**

UPAG's Rhythmic Gymnastics Technical Committee reviewed and approved this qualification system October 24th, 2012.

# **TECHNICAL MEETING**

• The Technical Meeting will take place **Sunday November 23rd** at the Central American and Caribbean Village in Veracruz at a time to be confirmed.

• Up to two representatives from each NOC will be able to assist this Technical Meeting.

• The invitation card for the Technical Meeting will be available to the Heads of Team at the Sports Information Center at the Central American and Caribbean Village upon their arrival.

• The Technical Delegate and the Organizing Committee's Competition Manager for Rhythmic Gymnastics will preside the meeting, which shall take place in Spanish and English.

# **TECHNICAL OFFICIALS**

Judges must comply with UPAG's regulations, if there are not enough judges who fulfill these requirements, an invitation will be extended to neutral judges until the required number of officials is reached. The Competition director will be designated by FMG.

Order of participation will be defined through a draw that will take place at the Technical Meeting.

### **MEDAL CEREMONIES**

Medal ceremonies will take place according to CACSO's General Regulations, Chapter XIII.

Individual Events:

- First place: Gold medal and diploma
- Second place: Silver medal and diploma
- Third place: Bronze medal and diploma

Team Events:

- First place: A diploma for the team and a gold medal and diploma for each athlete
- Second place: A diploma for the team and a silver medal and diploma for each athlete

• Third place: A diploma for the team and a bronze medal and diploma for each athlete
