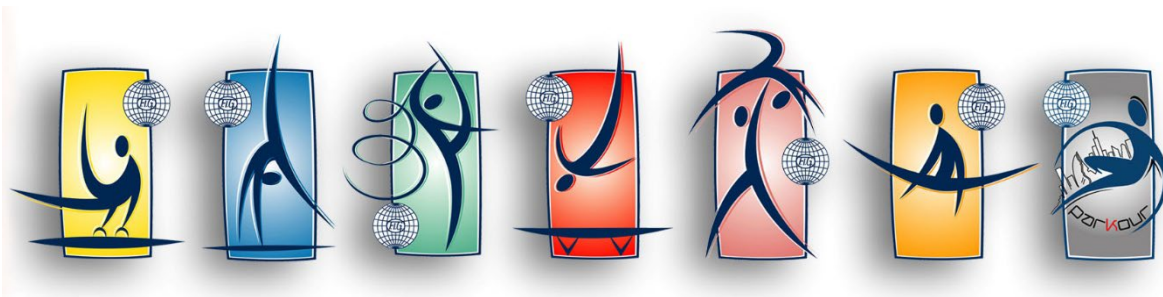

INTRODUCTION

In an effort to harmonize and simplify many aspects of the FIG disciplines, the FIG EC has taken the decision to remove a number of procedures from the COP. Concentrating these rules into one document allows the EC to be more flexible and react quicker if needed. Since these rules apply to all the disciplines then a more common understanding and better harmonization can be achieved. The following rules will be changed only by a decision of the EC and must be added as an appendix to the COP. In case of contradictions between these rules and the COP these rules shall prevail.

A) RULES FOR THE DUTIES OF THE SUPERIOR JURY AT FIG COMPETITIONS

1. Composition and duties of the Superior Jury

At official FIG Competitions with an officially assigned TD, the TC members (or cat. 1 judges designated by the TC) will constitute the Superior Jury and may act as Supervisors. More complete details regarding Superior Jury numbers for every group of competition can be found in the General Judges' Rules.

1.1 Role and duties of the Superior Jury President *

The TC Presidents or their representatives will serve as Presidents of the Superior Jury. In carrying out their responsibilities and those of the Superior Jury they are expected:

- to direct the competition as outlined in the TR;
- to call and chair all judges' meetings and instruction sessions;
- to apply the Judges' Regulations relevant to that competition;
- to apply the Rules for the use of IRCOS at the competitions where applicable;
- to deal with requests for evaluation of new elements;
- to make sure that the time schedule published in the Workplan is respected;
- to deal with inquiries as outlined herein as well as request of time and line reviews ;
- in cooperation with the members of the Superior Jury, to issue warnings or to replace any person acting in any judging capacity who is considered to be unsatisfactory or to have broken his/her oath;
- to supervise the measurement of the apparatus specifications according to the FIG Apparatus Norms;
- in unusual or special circumstances to nominate a judge to the competition;
- to control the work of the Supervisors and intervene if deemed necessary. Except in case of an inquiry, time or line errors, generally no change of score is allowed after the score has been flashed on the score board;
- to submit a report, which must be sent to the FIG Secretary General as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days after the event, which contains the following:
 - general remarks about the competition including special occurrences and conclusions for the future;
 - detailed list of all interventions (score changes before and after publication);
 - technical analyses of the D-Judges' scores;
 - detailed analyses of the judges' performance including proposals for rewarding the best judges and sanctions against the judges who failed to meet expectations.

1.2 Role and duties of the Superior Jury Members*

During each phase of the competition, the members of the TC or those individuals designated will serve as members of the Superior Jury or may serve as Supervisors. Their responsibilities include:

- to participate in the direction of the judges' meetings and instruction sessions and guide the judges to perform the correct work on their respective apparatus;
- to apply the rules of judges' control with fairness, consistency and completely in accordance with the currently valid regulations and criteria;
- to oversee their score component for each exercise;
- to assure that the gymnast is given the correct score for his/her performance;
- to check that the apparatus used at training, warm-up and competition comply with the FIG Apparatus Norms;

1.3 Role and duties of the TC

The TC must conduct a global PCVR and, depending on the discipline, analyse the E-scores, A-scores and D-scores of the judges to determine errors in judgment. The results of the judges' evaluation will be submitted for potential complaint to the GEF Disciplinary Commission (through the FIG Secretary General) or will be used to issue warnings (see General Judges Rules and Code of Discipline).

1.4 Procedures for all interventions

Intervention of the Supervisors can only be made through the President of the Superior Jury (except for inquiries, see TR).

In case of an intervention, the President of the Superior Jury must contact the judges concerned and inform them of the score given by the Supervisor. The judges have the choice to change their score. In case judges decide not to change the score, the President of the Superior Jury may overrule them.

The President of the Superior Jury shall keep a record of all interventions and all changes of scores. This must be included in the report of the event.

1.4.1 D-Score

Intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the D-Score shall take place:

- in case of an inquiry;
- in case of deviation between the Supervisor's score and the judges' D-Score as outlined in the specifications for each discipline.

1.4.2 E-Score and A-Score – Impossible Scores

Intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the E-, or A-Score shall take place only in case of impossible scores.

An impossible score is defined as follows:

When penalties/compulsory deductions* are higher than the individual judge's score:

Maximum score: 10.00 pts

Penalty/Compulsory deductions (e.g. fall ART): 1.00 pt.

Scores: 9.2 8.5 8.3 8.4 9.1 8.4 8.5

Impossible scores

* e.g. of Penalty/Compulsory deductions: (these are only a few examples, the list is not meant to be complete.)

- ART – Fall 1.00 pt;
- RG – Loss of apparatus 0.50/0.70/1.00 pt. Finishing without the apparatus 1.00 pt;
- TRA – Touch other than the bed during a routine 0.50 pt, verbal or other signs from coach 0.30 pt each;
- ACRO – Fall 1.00 pt;
- AER – Fall / multiple touches 1.00 pt, a touch 0.50 pt, etc.

When obviously a judge entered the score and not the deductions or vice-versa:

Scores: 1.9 8.2 8.0 8.1 7.9

Impossible score (should be 8.1)

1.4.3 E-Score and A-Score – Possible Scores

When the scores have a big difference:

Judges' scores: 7.9 8.1 8.8 7.8 8.0

The score must be accepted without interference, unless a block occurs. A block will be applied for E and A scores in all disciplines if any judge is more than 2.00 pts away from any other score given within a specific panel.

1.4.4 D-Score/E-Score or Final Score (according to the disciplines)

When a penalty is missed or not applied correctly by the person in charge:

Examples

- Line penalties
- Time penalties
- Attire penalties
- Disciplinary (behaviour) deductions

The President of the Superior Jury may intervene in all of these examples to ensure the correct penalty/deduction is applied.

1.4.5 Prevention of publication of impossible scores on the scoreboards and TV

In order to be able to intervene before the final score is released to the public, the respective Supervisor (ART) and the President of Superior Jury is given the possibility to stop the publication of the final score and to block the result system. For this purpose, the result system shall provide a clearly marked **stop** device or key which must be activated by either the Supervisor or the President of the Superior Jury within 10 (ten) seconds after the last score appears.

Should the score not be stopped within 10 seconds, the score is released automatically.

The result system shall block automatically in case of non-allowed deviations between the D-scores of the judges' panel and the D-score of the Supervisor as described in the clarifications specific for each discipline here below, as well as in the case of a deviation of more than 2.00 pts between any score given within a specific panel. Please refer to the specifications for RG.

2. Clarifications specific for Artistic Gymnastics

The Superior Jury Presidents are also responsible for the following:

- to deal with requests for raising the Horizontal Bar or the Uneven Bars and other issues that may arise;
- to approve the repetition of an exercise without deduction due to broken handguard or exercise interrupted for reasons beyond gymnast's control or responsibility.

The Superior Jury Members also have the following responsibilities:

- when acting as a Supervisor (one Supervisor per apparatus for the Qualifications, Team Final and All-Around Final and two per apparatus for Apparatus Finals) they shall first judge and supervise the D-Score. The Supervisors' D-Score must be entered into the scoring system. The Supervisors shall first enter their score, before the scoring system allows them to see the final and individual judges' scores;
- to record the entire exercise content in symbol notation;
- to calculate the D-Score (Control Scores)
- Intervention for the D-Score shall take place in the following cases (if an electronic system is available, the system shall block automatically):

Qualifications

- If the D-jury score is lower than the AS score by 0.50 or more
- If the D-jury score is higher than the AS score by 0.30 or more

Team Final and All-Around Final

- If the D-jury score is lower than the AS score by 0.50 or more

- If the D-jury score is higher than the AS score by 0.20 or more

Apparatus Finals

- If the D-jury score is lower than the AS score by 0.50 or more
- If the D-jury score is higher than the AS score by 0.10 or more

The interventions' procedures also include:

The block of the score for either the D-and/or the E-Scores shall activate a video review of the exercise by an independent and neutral panel (i.e., composed of persons who were not involved in the generation/creation/review of the original score). The panel is set up of the President of the Superior Jury and 1 or 2 independent Supervisors not involved in the D-, or E-Score or its supervision.

3. Clarifications specific for Rhythmic Gymnastics (For competitions where the participation of all TC Members is required)

The duties of the Superior Jury are as follows:

If two judges' panels (panel A and B) are working simultaneously:

- 1 Superior Jury member acts as President of the Superior Jury
- 1 Superior Jury member acts as Assistant to the President of the Superior Jury
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Difficulty Body in Panel A
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Difficulty Apparatus in Panel A
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Difficulty Body for in Panel B
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Difficulty Apparatus for in Panel B
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Artistry in Panel A and B
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Execution in Panel A and B

If the competition does not run alternatively (1 panel only, also Ind. Apparatus Finals):

- 1 Superior Jury member acts as President of the Superior Jury

- 1 Superior Jury member acts as Assistant to the President of the Superior Jury
- 2 Superior Jury members give a Control Score for Difficulty Body
- 2 Superior Jury members give a Control Score for Difficulty Apparatus
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Artistry
- 1 Superior Jury member gives a Control Score for Execution

The D-, A- and E-scores are registered in the scoring system. The members of the Superior Jury (not President) shall first type in their score, before the scoring system allows them to see the final and individual judges' scores.

D-Score

Intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the D-Score (DB and DA) shall take place in case the Supervisors' D-Score is lower or higher than the D-score of the D-judges; the tolerances between the D-Score and the Supervisor's D-Score have been defined based on past experiences. The President of the Superior Jury must intervene for the D-Scores as follows (if an electronic system is available, the system shall block automatically):

If the score of the Supervisor is lower or higher by more than 0.50 pt than the score of the DB jury or the DA jury.

A-Deductions

Intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the A-Score shall take place in case the Supervisor A-Deductions are lower or higher than the Final A-Deductions (calculated as defined in the CoP, based on the A1-A4 Judges); the tolerances between the Final A-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor's A-Deduction have been defined based on past experiences. The President of the Superior Jury must intervene for A1-A4 Deductions according to the table below (if an electronic system is available, the system shall block automatically):

The Final A-Deduction (the first column) decides the maximum allowed delta (the second column) between the Final A-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor A-Deductions:

Final A-Deduction	Allowed delta between Final A-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor A-Deduction
0.00 – 1.20	0.399
More than 1.20	0.699

E-Deductions

Intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the E-Score shall take place in case the Supervisor's E-Deductions are lower or higher than the Final E-Deduction (calculated as defined in the CoP, based on the E1-E4 Judges); the tolerances between the Final E-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor's E-Deduction have been defined based on past experiences. The President of the Superior Jury must intervene for E1-E4 Deductions according to the table below (if an electronic system is available, the system shall block automatically):

The Final E-Deduction (the first column) decides the maximum allowed delta (the second column) between the Final E-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor E-Deduction:

Final E-Deduction	Allowed delta between Final E-Deduction and the correspondent Supervisor E-Deduction
0.00 – 1.20	0.399
More than 1.20	0.699

Intervention procedure:

The intervention of the President of the Superior Jury for the D-score, A-score and/or E-score shall activate a video review of the exercise. The video review is conducted by the President of the Superior Jury and/or (if applicable to the event) the Assistant to the President of the Superior Jury. The video review of the full exercise will determine which of the two Scores/Deductions is correct; the Score/Deduction by the Jury or the Score/Deduction by the Supervisor(s).

In every case that the Deduction of the A/E Jury is changed, all 4 Deductions will be changed to the same value. Example: E1-E4 2.0 2.1 2.1 3.0, Supervisor 2.9, E1-E4 all change to 2.9.

In all cases where the Deduction of the Supervisor is changed and the Jury Final Deduction has two decimals, the Deduction resulting in the smaller change is applied: Jury Final Deduction 1.55, Supervisor Deduction 2.5, Supervisor change to 1.6 (not 1.5).

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4. Clarifications specific for Trampoline Gymnastics

The duties of the Superior Jury are as follows:

- If 2 or more judges' panels are working simultaneously:
 - (IND/TUM/DMT) For each panel 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution and 1 for the Control Score in Difficulty.
 - (SYN) For each panel 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution and 1 member shall give a Control Score in Difficulty.
- If the competition is not run simultaneously:
 - (IND/TUM/DMT) **2** members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution and **2** members for the Control Score in Difficulty
 - (SYN) 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution and **2** members for the Control Score in Difficulty.

4.1 D-Score

The respective Supervisors must intervene through the President of the Superior Jury if their D-Score deviates from the score of the D-Judges. Difficulty in TRA must be exact. No deviations between the scores are allowed. Score is blocked.

4.2 E-Score

The result system shall block automatically if the deduction of the Supervisors are lower or higher by 0.50 point, per skill than the deduction of the E Jury (E1-E6).

4.3 Position of the Superior Jury (Head Table)

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5. Clarifications specific for Acrobatic Gymnastics

The duties of the Superior Jury are as follows::

- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution
- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Artistry
- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Difficulty

5.1 D-Score

The D-Supervisors must intervene through the President of the Superior Jury if the score of the D-Judges deviates from the score of the D-Supervisors. Difficulty in ACRO must be exact. No deviations between the scores are allowed.

The D-Supervisors must intervene through the President of the Superior Jury if a time fault is not deducted correctly by the D-Judges. If the D-Judges and the D-Supervisor do not agree, the President of the Superior Jury will take the final decision.

5.2 Position of the Superior Jury (Head Table)

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6. Clarifications specific for Aerobic Gymnastics

The duties of the Superior Jury are as follows::

- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Difficulty
- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Artistic
- 2 members are responsible for the Control Score in Execution

6.1 D-Score

The D-Supervisor must intervene through the President of the Superior Jury if the score and the deduction of the D-Judges deviates from the score and deduction of the D-Supervisors. Difficulty score and deduction in AER must be exact. No deviations between the scores are allowed.

6.2 Position of Superior Jury (Head Table)

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B) RULES FOR THE USE OF IRCOS

Directives for the restricted use of IRCOS during the competition

In order to avoid abusive and excessive use and video judging and in order to guarantee the competition runs on schedule, the use of IRCOS must be strictly restricted and ruled as follows:

IRCOS may be used only in case of an inquiry or a blocked score

Exceptions:

- IRCOS shall be available at all times for the President of the Superior Jury, the Jury of Appeal / Competition Supervisory Board as well as the FIG President and Secretary General.
- IRCOS shall be available for the Supervisors after having given their scores.
- IRCOS shall be available for the D-Judges in MAG and WAG upon request in the case of "0-vault".
- IRCOS shall be available at all times in TRA for the President of the Superior Jury, in case of any ToF or HD unavailable score (human mistake in using the machine or breakdown of the HTMD machine).

Reasoning:

IRCOS is **NOT** intended to replace the existing judging system by a video judging system.

IRCOS has the following purposes:

During the competition:

Support tool for: The President and the members of the Superior Jury
 The Jury of Appeal / Competition Supervisory Board
 The Panel treating inquiries

Depending on the discipline, the D-Judges in case of intervention of the Supervisor or the President of the Superior Jury

After the competition:

Tool for Control and analysis of the judging
 Education videos for coaches, judges and for the Academies

C) INVALID RESULT MARKS

General Principles for IRM

The performances of Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group in an event or a phase which do not meet the FIG rules for a valid result are marked with IRM.

The IRM Rules are valid for all FIG sanctioned competitions. These Rules also apply when several athletes compete together and one score is received.

A "0" (zero) score given to an Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group, if outlined in the Code of Points of a respective discipline, is a valid score and is not considered as an IRM.

For TRA IND, the athletes may have the option of not performing one of the exercises from Q1. In this case a dash (-) will be used.

Designation and Definitions for IRM

Specific designations are used to define and report IRM:

Did Not Start (DNS)

DNS indicates that the Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group did not perform a routine/exercise/run, or did not receive any score or any value(s) for the elements/skills/tricks attempted, or did not perform the routine/exercise/run with the announced set of athletes, as outlined in the Code of Points for each discipline.

Did Not Finish (DNF)

DNF indicates that the Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group did not complete a competition phase after having started.

Disqualified for Breach of FIG Competition Rules (DSQ)

DSQ indicates a disqualification made by FIG officials

Disqualified for Serious Unsportsmanlike Behavior (DQB)

DQB indicates a disqualification due to any violation of the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code, or any other serious breach of applicable regulations issued by the IOC, the FIG or an NF/NOC.

Did Not Count (DNC)

In PK, DNC indicates when in qualification (Speed and Freestyle) an athlete requests a "redo". As a result, his first score doesn't count.

Consequences for IRM

General Consequences for all IRM (DNS, DNF, DSQ, DQB, DNC)

- No ranking, no series' points (if calculated), no medals and no prize money are awarded.
- Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group with several IRMs as a Total appear at the end of the Results concerned, in this order: DNF, DNS, DSQ, DQB, DNC.
- If several Athletes/Teams/Units/Pairs/Groups have the same IRM, they are ordered alphabetically by National Federation.

Additional Consequences for DNS and DNF.

Detailed examples of the consequences of DNF and DNS for all competition phases are described below for each discipline and follow the below principles:

- A combination of “scores” and “DNS” will result in “DNF” as a Total and no Ranking (see exceptions for the individual “Qualification Results”, i.e., in ART).
- “DNS” only, without “score”, will result in “DNS” as a Total and no Ranking.

Additional Consequences for DSQ and DQB:

- For DQB, the IOC in consultation with the FIG, have complete discretion regarding whether an Athlete/Team/Unit/Pair/Group will be disqualified from a single event, or some, or all of the events entered (completed, in progress or future).
- In Qualifications (see below the special provisions for Team competitions), DSQ and DQB mean
 - the name of the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group is removed
 - the results of the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group are removed
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group is not considered for ranking
 - the overall ranking concerned is recalculated.
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group cannot proceed to any Finals.
- In Finals (see below the special provisions for Team competitions), DSQ and DQB mean that:
 - the name of the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group is removed
 - the results of the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group are removed
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group is not considered for ranking
 - the overall ranking concerned is recalculated.
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group is not eligible for any medals or prize money.
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit/Pair/Group may compete in subsequent Finals if qualified.
- For Team competitions in the disciplines concerned, when a Team result is made of several Athletes/Unit scores, if one or more Athlete/Unit receives DSQ and/or DQB:
 - the name of the concerned Athlete/Unit is removed
 - the results of the concerned Athlete/Unit are removed
 - the total of the Team is recalculated.
 - the overall Team ranking is recalculated.
 - the concerned Athlete/Unit is not eligible for any medals or prize money.

- the concerned Athlete/Unit may compete in other subsequent Finals if qualified
- In the “Results Book”, the motivations for DSQ or DQB must be included in the legend section.
- In case of post-competition DSQ and DQB, the “Results Books” must be updated and republished.


